VI. New Membership

A. Okc Patriots Football

Discussion and Decision: First of all, we will poll all of the current OCSAA Football Programs. If the Patriots receive a majority vote of 75% from the Football Schools, the Patriots will be allowed to participate in the Fall of 2010 on a 1 year trial basis. The Patriots will be required to provide Birth Certificates for all of their athletes and they will have to adhere to the OCSAA CO-OP rules. Permanent membership will be determined next Spring.

Results of Football Coaches Vote: 5 “Yes”, 4 “No”, and 1 “No Vote”. The Patriots did not receive a 75% majority and was denied membership.

B. Cross Christian Academy

Decision: Cross Christian Academy was granted membership into the OCSAA and will be placed on a 1 year probation period to ensure that all OCSAA rules are being followed.

C. Providence Academy, Ark.

Decision: Providence Christian Academy was granted membership and will be placed on a 1 year probation period to ensure that all OCSAA rules are being followed. There are more Arkansas schools that are interested in joining the OCSAA. Future expansion of the OCSAA is very likely. Several Associations cross state borders. The Mississippi Association has members from Arkansas and Louisiana.
